If prior mammograms cannot be obtained, additional imaging (or possible even biopsy) may be recommended. Abnormal. Your examination showed an abnormality that requires a biopsy. The only way that you can be sure that the abnormality is benign (not cancer) is to sample or surgically remove the area of concern and send these samples for pathological analysis. Your physician or referring health care provider will be informed about the need for this biopsy. You should contact your provider as soon as possible (if you have not already done so.) Any recommended additional studies require a written order from your physician. If additional studies have been recommended, please call (904) 855-0700 to schedule appointment. Please obtain the proper order from your physician prior to your appointment. Alternatively, your physician may fax the appropriate order directly to this center at (904) 855-0739. Although mammography is the most accurate method for early detection of breast cancer, not all cancers are found using mammography alone. A breast finding of concern should never be ignored. If you notice any new changes in your breasts you should consult your health care provider.

American Cancer Society Guidelines for Breast Cancer Screening

- Annual (yearly) mammograms starting at age 40
- Breast exam by a physician every year for women older than 40 yrs (every 3 yrs for women in their 20's and 30's)
- Report any concerning breast changes promptly to your health care provider. Properly performed monthly self breast examinations may be of benefit for many women.
- Women considered at increased risk for breast cancer may require earlier or more frequent imaging studies.
